Hello Parents/Carers and welcome to week 4 of term 4!

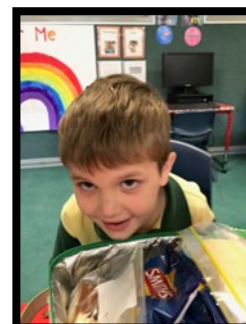
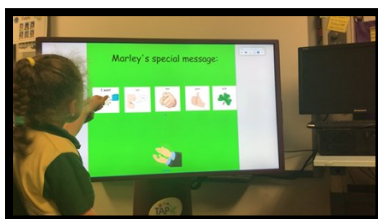
Wow, where has the year gone? This term is a particularly busy one as we start new programs, finish off programs and before we know it we'll be preparing for special Christmas events!

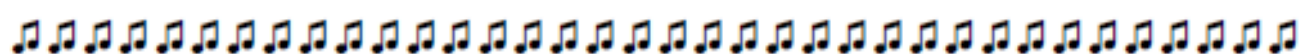
